DHARADUN, 24 April: After the success of Project Suwasdarshan, UPES continues its commitment to community development with the conclusion of Project GROW. Launched in January 2024, Project GROW, a joint initiative of the School for Life and CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility), UPES, was aimed at providing a transformative experience to the administrative staff by enhancing their English language proficiency and communication skills.
