Anju Chaudhri Srivastava, added, "In today's dynamic business environment, it is crucial for educational institutions to foster an entrepreneurial mindset among students, empowering them to innovate and lead with integrity. Furthermore, embedding ethical considerations into business practices is essential to prepare students to navigate challenges responsibly in an ever-evolving marketplace."

The conclave also featured a lively panel discussion, moderated by Hoshie Ghaswala, comprising key industry leaders and academicians. The panel addressed pressing issues such as the necessary curriculum changes for future readiness, the importance of preparing students for the realities of the business world, and the need to disrupt existing industry relationships to drive real change.
