UPES Dehradun today signed a memorandum of understanding with the University of Law (ULaw) to launch a Centre of Excellence (CoE) at UPES. The Centre of Excellence (CoE) will facilitate Continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses, satellite centers, and a start-up incubator to nurture innovation and entrepreneurship among students and faculty.
